# 文化融合 社區共建

■ 編輯組

第四屆亞凱迪亞中秋晚會,於九 月三十日在洛杉磯植物園盛大舉行, 數千民眾攜親朋好友,各族裔共聚月 下,欣賞傳統文化表演、品嚐傳統月 餅和各國美食,其樂融融。在具有「 團圓 | 美好意願的中秋佳節,不同族 裔團聚共享月圓時刻,正是契合了我 們「文化融合、社區共建」的主題。

作為移民國家,美國有着「民族 大熔爐」之美譽,各個國家民族的人 來到這片土地,追逐夢想,打造自己 的新生活。他們既帶來自己原生國家 和民族的風俗習慣、傳統文化,也接 觸和體驗著這片土地上其他居民的文 化與習俗,形成獨特的共生文化。我 們談文化融合,不是放棄自己原有的 傳統文化,融入「主流」,也不是單 方面地推崇我們的傳統文化,而是期 望在我們的社區達成「和而不同」的 多種文化共存、交融的和諧狀態。

「和而不同」的概念原出自《論 語・子路第十三》,原文是「君子和 而不同,小人同而不和。」孔子講 的是社會中做人的道理, 而放在當今 社會,也正是多元文化共存的條件。 「和而不同」追求的是內在的和諧和 統一,儘管外在表現不盡一樣,在豐 富多彩中追求和諧,我們的世界本來 就是一個「和而不同」的多樣性的世 界,我們的社區也是同樣。

文化的融合是歷史的趨勢,在歷 史長河中,各種文化相互融合,又保 留原有的傳統,新舊融合,形成獨特 的新多元文化。在我們的社區中,隨 裔人數比起30多年前大幅增加,在入 鄉隨俗慶祝西方節日、尊重社區約定

俗成的傳統的同時,也帶來了東方民 族獨有的文化傳統和生活元素,與社 區的其他居民共享。

追逐美好和快樂是人類的天性。 在歡樂的節日和活動中,我們更容易 去接受與我們不同的、新鮮的、歡 樂的文化元素。無論是其他族裔參 與中秋節、春節的慶祝,在626夜市 上大快朵頤,還是華裔入鄉隨俗在 萬聖節、感恩節老少同樂,這些都是 容易實現和接受的文化共享。但在與 我們的習慣、風俗和文化不相同的 時候,我們却很容易忘記當初的其樂 融融。而會有「你們」、「我們」、 「他們」的想法。因此,「文化融 合」的另一面是文化寬容,保持開放 的心態、寬容的態度,增進彼此的了 解、互相欣賞不同文化之美。

我們也要看到文化差異背後共同 的真善美人性。除去傳統習俗、語 言、生活習慣的不同,我們都是在這 個社區、這片土地為自己、家庭和社 區打造美好生活的人。只要懷著共贏 的信念,秉持尊重、理解、寬容的態 度,以和為貴以達到這一共同目標。 多接觸、多參與、多溝通,這正是華 協在推動社區文化融合中起到的重要 作用。華協的義工們正是懷著為整個 社區服務的心願,創造機會促進社區 的各個族裔之間的文化交流與共享。

正如著名社會學家費孝通老先生 在20多年前曾指出過的「各美其美, 美人之美,美美與共,天下大同一, 尊重自己民族的文化傳統,尊重其他 著新移民結構的改變,亞凱迪亞的亞 民族的文化傳統,尊重文化的多樣 性,實現「和而不同」的理想境界, 讓不同文化的美在我們的社區綻放。

## Culture Kathy Symons Rio Hondo College Art History Professor Emeritus

An appreciation for different cultures has been a passion of mine for many years. As a former Art History professor it was necessary for me to learn about the cultures that I taught about in my classes. Since I taught about many cultures worldwide it was important that I have a extensive knowledge. This also encouraged my love of travel. In order to have some understanding of different cultures you need to visit the countries of their origin. Here in Arcadia we are very lucky to have such a variety of cultures represented in our community. We have the opportunity to appreciate them by the variety of restaurants we can enjoy.

My cultural based travel since my last entry was in October of last year, 2016 when Joanna Liang and I joined an Eldertrek trip to Iran. I have always wanted to travel to Iran since I used to teach about ancient art history. Top on my list was to see the ancient complex of Persepolis near Shiraz. This site includes Royal Palaces and Audience Halls made of stone to honor the Achaemenian Dynasty of Kings Darius and Xerxes dating back to 500 B.C. The fact that these ruins have survived the destruction and fires of Alexander the Great's conquest in 335 B.C. is amazing. Their size and scale is comparable to the Temples of Luxor in Ancient Egypt. Another highlight was the grandiose Mosques of fahan and Yazd with intricate brightly colored tiles. It was also exciting to learn about Iran's ancient religion of Zoroastrianism. We were amazed at the openness and generosity of the Iranian people. Sadly with the recent attempts

to block visits from certain Muslim countries. Americans can no longer travel to Iran. Hopefully this will change.

In February of 2017 Joanna and I traveled to Northern Mexico to the Copper Canyon area. We were impressed by the grandeur of this huge canyon. Also we enjoyed meeting the local Tarahumara Indians. The Tarahumara live in remote parts of the Canyon and are still semi nomadic. They have experienced many hardships including being exploited by drug dealers and encouraged to change their traditional lives. We visited a boarding school for young Tarahumara girls where they are getting an education, but are also encouraged to give up their traditional language and culture. It reminded me of the American Indians in our country being forced to leave home to go to boarding schools and give up their culture in the early 20th century.

In March we traveled to Northern Greece, Albania, Macedonia and Serbia. In Northern Greece we appreciated the beautiful Orthodox Christian churches and monasteries on the steep mountains of Meteora and the tomb of Phillip of Macedonia, Alexander the Great's father. In Albania we learned of the strange Communism of Hoxha that dominated from 1970-1990. We also visited the city of Gjirokaster with its distinctive stone architecture. We also visited Macedonia with more scenic churches in Ohrid and village life. We ended in Serbia with Easter celebrations and more colorful churches.

## **Bridging Cultures** Building Community in the Beginning

Generations of immigrants have reached the shores of America and the shores of California and the borders of Arcadia. It started when Arcadia was not even Arcadia, but some piece of dirt to be cultivated and made productive.

Who comes and why they come is the same generations over - to find a better life for themselves and to make a better life for their family.

For some, the journey has been perilous, and, for others, easy. But no matter what, a family has been left behind, a culture has been surrendered, a lifestyle has been altered. Granted, a language, traditions, customs, and celebrations can continue, but the old way of life has been meshed with the new

Who comes into a community, and why, may be happenstance or opportunity. But Arcadia has been built on happenstance and opportunity.

Would Arcadia have become Arcadia if it had not been for Elias J. "Lucky" Baldwin? This will never be known. But paths have been forged and this is where we are - in an Arcadia that is quite diverse.

Many may believe that the Chinese community is relatively new to Arcadia, which may be true in numbers of individuals, but not in vears. A Chinese presence in Arcadia has been here from the beginning, even before Arcadia became a city.

In an LA Times article on May 20, 1903, Baldwin stated that of his workers, he had "22 Chinese" on his ranch. At the time, census-takers

were gathering names and numbers on the proposed population of "Arcadia." They then presented a roll of pink paper about six feet long before the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County and it contained the names of 692 people. One of the census takers exclaimed. "These are the 'Arcadians'."

The Los Angeles Sunday Times back on March 9, 1902 stated that Elias J. "Lucky" Baldwin was a "Friend of Chinese Labor" and quoted Baldwin as stating, "The Exclusion Law is a mistake . . . it is impossible to get enough American Laborers to fill the demand." The article goes on to say, "On the Santa Anita Ranch there are about 3,000 acres of orchard, more than a thousand acres being in citrus fruits. Baldwin does his own packing and marketing . . . . He employs chiefly Chinese labor in his orchards. He says the Chinese are the most reliable laborers he can get."

An original ranch labor ledger labeled RAN-CHO SANTA ANITA 1875 to 1909, ELIAS J. "LUCKY" BALDWIN, housed at the Huntington Library in San Marino, California indicates a partial list of names of employees at the Baldwin Ranch from 1901 to 1903. In this list, the names of Al Wong and Ah Sing appear.

The Los Angeles County Arboretum has a collection of personal items belonging to Lem Kay, a Hong Kong native, who was an employee of the Baldwin Ranch from the 1890s to the early 1900s. Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Mc-Cracken donated the personal effects of Lem Kay to the Arboretum in 1973 after Kay's death. According to the McCrackens, Lem

Kay survived past the age of 95 and had resided in a small house on the McCracken property in Gardena since the early 1920s. Included in the collection was a Chinese newspaper article (The Young China Pictorial, June 23, 1940) in which Lem Kay was interviewed. In the interview. Lem Kay stated that he was 94 years of age and had lived in the U.S. since his arrival from Hong Kong at the age of 21. He said that he originally worked for the railroad and later as a gardener and tenant farmer. He had only three years of schooling, but had married and had a son and a daughter he left behind in Hong Kong. Among the personal effects is a letter addressed to the Baldwin Ranch in 1891. The McCrackens said it was Lem Kay's request for employment and local interpretation indicates that the Chinese characters on the envelope ask that whoever handles the letter forward it on to the Baldwin Ranch. Also included in the effects is an 1892

state poll tax receipt for "Low Sing at Baldwin's Ranch," perhaps a friend who got Lem Kay a job there, and Lem Kay's own state poll tax receipt on June 8, 1901 for \$2.00. The collection of personal effects also includes Chinese pottery, gaming pieces, clothing, pipes and numerous hand-written letters.

In the Arcadia as we know it today, people have come and gone. And some have left their mark, be it a rich landowner or a simple laborer. The community of Arcadia will always be shifting and changing as it has done for more than 100 years. The look of Arcadia and Arcadians will continue to evolve as long as people seek a better life, a better opportunity and a place to fit in.

## A Family Set on Bridging Cultures and **Building Community Within**

President of the Arcadia Historical Society & Secretary of the Arcadia Chinese Association

My husband Cary and I have been working on bridging cultures and building community within our family for 30 years. He, Asian; I, Caucasian. The blending of cultures takes patience, understanding, compromise, trust and honesty, but these qualities are the same that build any strong family.

We both came from traditional, conservative backgrounds so we have very similar goals, values and vision of the world, even though our cultures were very different. We both come from a long line of farmers: my husband's family can be traced back 400 years to Hebei, China; my family can be traced back 250 years to Alsace-Lorraine, Europe. The biggest challenge we had in bridging our cultures was not in the differences we had, but in how to raise our daughter. My husband and I were polar opposites. I tend to look forward, search beyond, see what my future may hold or how I might shape it; my husband tends to take life as it happens.

I started to hear my husband use the phrase "When I was a kid . . ." to pacify our daughter Ellen when she wasn't going to get something that she wanted or that she had to do as she was told. I grew up with the same traditional directives. There was no discussion, there was no negotiation, there was no democracy, and there were few decisions to be made. I didn't want my daughter to feel what I felt at age 18, "unprepared for the world." So I was on a mission, and through a process, my husband turned over the child-rearing reins to me.

Early on, my husband faced a hard lesson. He believed that just being our daughter's father would automatically seal her devotion and love for him. But out of arguments and anger came Ellen's tears, which he didn't deal with very well. "Your relationship with your daughter begins now. You will spend more years with our daughter as an adult, than as a child, how do you want that relationship to be? If she doesn't like you, she never has to visit you." These harsh words hit home, and he became very protective of his relationship with her.

My husband also grew up in a family that didn't offer praise to their children; they didn't want to say their child was good for fear that the child would turn bad. I would say, "Please be positive, not negative." My husband didn't realize the negative comments coming out of his mouth until I started counting them up out loud. He learned to praise Ellen for some accomplishment that she could feel proud of, like the memorization of Multiplication Tables or the ability to explain what she had read. We asked her to compete against herself, and not others, to improve upon her own accomplishments

At times, I would catch myself saying to my husband, "We do not live in China, we live in America. We have to help Ellen live in her world, not your world." As a parent, it's just easier telling your kid what to do, but our daughter would have to face challenges that we never had to face - like the possibility of drugs, alcohol, weapons in schools, or bullying. Neither of us wanted a child who would be afraid to communicate to us and tell us what was going on in her life. We needed to prepare her to think, communicate, analyze, negotiate and make good choices. The only way she could do that if we helped her to practice and allowed her to make decisions for herself. I wanted her to make all her mistakes by age 18, while she was in the safety of her family.

Only once was Ellen conflicted with a choice of identity. She had to fill out a form, which requested her race. She was to check a box, and for her it was either Caucasian or Asian. She didn't want to select one or the other because she felt that one selection would deny her of her true self, but what was she to do.

I suggested that she align her race with her name to make things less complicated, and possibly easier for others. After all, she was filling out a form and the form did not make her who she was, or a label to dictate who she would be.

It's nice to know that our daughter is happy with who she is. She loves that there is diversity in her life. She also loves the fact that she gets to celebrate Christmas and Chinese New Year, Moon Festival and Halloween, and eat Dim Sum and Thanksgiving dinner. She was born in the year of the Dragon and under the sign of Aquarius. And she has two passports, one with a Chinese name and one with an American name. She can be two different people, and yet, be the same.



# **Cross Cultures**

Cary Hou Tour Director

My career didn't start out as a Tour Director. In fact, I graduated from Fu Ren Catholic University in Taiwan with a Library Science degree. But after coming to the States, I fell into the job through a friend of mine and have been travelling ever since.

Just recently, my wife asked me what my most memorable tour was. I would have to say it was my first tour to Alaska almost 30 years ago. I found myself in an environment that was like nothing that I had seen before. Our group took a cruise ship to Juneau, Alaska, disembarked and caught a small plane to Gustavas, Alaska. We were to stay at Glacier Bay Lodge and a shuttle picked us up for a 30-minute ride to Bartlett Cove. This was the headquarters for the Glacier Bay National Park.

It was the first time that I was able to observe the brilliant tidewater glaciers, sparkling blue in the distance. We joined a small boat cruise that took us along the magnificent Glacier Bay for a 9-hour trip. It didn't feel like a 9-hour trip because there was so much to see. Every bend along the shore brought a new sight: forests that hugged the ridges, glaciers that dipped into the sea and wildlife that made no mind of us. Harbor seals, Stellar sea lions, sea otters, porpoises and even a humpback whale seemed to put on a show for us. The tour was so relaxing and uplifting that it set how I was to present tours for the next 30 years. Touring was not just a destination, but also a life experience to be fully enjoyed.

I began to research each place that I would lead my group. I wanted to tell the story of the culture of the area – the people, customs, language and history. I gathered as many facts as I could on the environment, geologic conditions, astronomy, science, plant life and animal life, historic happenings and colorful characters that left their legacy tied to the location. In doing so, the travel experiences became much more meaningful to my tourists.

Over the years, I have taken Chinese tourists up and down the western United States and to other popular U. S. tourist locations, into the Canadian Rockies, into Mexico on both east and west coasts, and to the Caribbean.

I have to say that my most enjoyable trips were those with my daughter, Ellen. I took her on her first cruise to the Mexican Rivera: Cabo San Lucas, Mazatlan, and Puerto Vallarta when she was thirteen. We had a mini suite, which included a sitting room, two sleeping areas and a beverage bar. She especially enjoyed the swimming pool, onboard trivia games, and we ended up winning the ship's Ping-Pong championship.

The next summer when Ellen was fourteen, we did a one-month excursion through Grand Teton National Park, Yellowstone, Canadian Rockies including Calgary, Jasper and Banff in Alberta, and ended up at Vancouver. On this trip, I was working on my second book, Come Follow Me: All Roads Lead to Rockies. I was taking photos, collecting information from the locals, and writing notes that would go into

my book. My daughter recalls many wonderful memories, mostly having to do with the wildlife we encountered. She was able to see Bighorn sheep, mountain goats, elk, moose and bear, but the most exciting were the orcas. It was on our last few days in Vancouver that we boarded a fast-speed boat heading up the Georgia Strait near Vancouver. I will never forget the sheer enjoyment on my daughter's face when we encountered a pod of eight to ten orcas that were swimming alongside our boat; some coming up and out of the water as if to get a better look at us. We were only to see them for a few minutes and then the pod took off in a different direction and was gone. Even for that short time, they remain forever in our memory. The best memories are the ones that are shared.

Through my travels whether for work or pleasure, I have always respected the culture and the people that I encountered, and respected other tourists as well. I have tried to past on this concept to my daughter and my tourists through the years. We want to follow the rules and regulations, to be mindful of others and to make the experience enjoyable for everyone. Simply following common courtesies leave good impressions. I had only one instance in my career that really surprised me and left me stunned.

I was the tour guide for a small group that was on a spiritual pilgrimage to the Native American Watch Tower in the Grand Canyon National Park in Arizona. Our group was with other tour groups at the location and all of a sudden my group of individuals started chanting and dancing as they were in the midst of others. I was utterly shocked because I did not know they were going to do this and felt

that they were imposing on the other tourists who had come to the site as well. I didn't say anything or try to stop them. I just let them go on, hoping that no one would be upset with what had gone on. When my group finished their chanting and dancing, the other groups of tourists started clapping for them to demonstrate appreciation for their performance. It is my belief that they thought my tourists were scheduled performers at the site. Wow, was I doubly surprised?!

## **Experience of Bridging Cultures and Building Community**

#### **Bridging Cultures**

In the 1970s, as newly-weds, Mable and I bought our first home in Arcadia. Since we grew up in metropolitan Hong Kong, we were used to the exciting and hectic city life. Our hospitable neighbors, Jake and Betty Clinton, grew up in the Midwest and enjoyed calm, family-oriented living with their two young sons. We enjoyed chatting with one another and learning about our cultural heritage. We also learned that they were high-school sweethearts who became a loving, married couple. They were completely devoted to each other and to their children. They shared the joy of the birth of our children by attending our family celebrations. Gradually we bridged our cultures with great friendship and understanding, and remain life-long friends even after we moved.

Many years later, I was sponsored by NASA JPL in completing NASA's project management training at NASA Wallops, Virginia. I also completed Stanford University's Advanced Project Management Program. One significant lesson I learned when I completed Stanford University's Advanced Project Management Program was the importance of understanding cultures and cultural backgrounds. Recalling from memory, I learned from an example of comparing two athletes when they were interviewed after winning the Olympic medals. One athlete from a country thanked her coach and went on to describe her determination, perseverance, and hard work in order to accomplish her goal. Another athlete from another country talked very little about herself but spent most of the time expressing

gratitude to her coach and many other people including her mother-in-law. This example illustrates how individuals are influenced by their cultural backgrounds. To bridge the cultures in order to have good communications and better understanding, we must be proactive in learning about the cultures of other nations.

As one of the managers at NASA/JPL/Caltech before I retired. I was thrilled to work on various missions to Mars and the Voyager Interstellar Mission. I also worked on many joint NASA projects with other international space agencies, including the Cassini-Huygens mission to Saturn and Titan, and the Ulysses Mission to explore the Sun. Both the Cassini-Huygens mission (NASA being the main sponsor) and the Ulysses mission are sponsored by the European Space Agency consisting of about twenty European member countries. I was also a U.S. delegate at International meetings. To bridge the cultural gaps when I interacted with the professionals from other countries, I came up with the following six principles:

- 1. Take an interest in learning about the his tory and customs of other cultures. This will broaden your mind and horizon.
- 2. Learn the greetings in the local language and use them with a smile.
- 3. Appreciate and recognize the differences in cultures and customs.
- 4. Conduct negotiations in a clear, honest and firm way while providing flexibility.
- 5. Always be kind and tolerant.
- 6. Build excellent working relationships.

I applied the above principles whenever I traveled to Germany, France, the U.K., Australia, Spain, Italy, Finland, the Czech Republic and Brazil. As a result, we had excellent collaborations with fruitful results and established excellent working relationships. Some of the working relationships flourished, leading to long-lasting friendship. To my great satisfaction, even though I am a retiree now, I still have wonderful friends in France, Germany, the U.K., Brazil and Spain. In addition, while attending a meeting in Australia, I met a visitor from Slovenia and we have become longtime friends. I count these friendships as the fruit of bridging cultures.

#### **Building Community**

Building community is focused on all the people in the community instead of a selected few. In an ideal world we would like our community to have attributes including the following:

- Happy residents, harmonious neighbors
- Excellent schools, excellent library
- Clean air, excellent water quality
- · Green environment, excellent neighborhoods
- Ample opportunities for employment
- Superior hospital and medical services
- Excellent fire and police protection
- Duly elected officials of integrity
- Thriving opportunities for businesses
- Availability of parks and recreation
- Reliable utilities, infrastructures
- Excellent cultural, entertainment
- Compassionate senior care
- Learning and Activities for all ages
- Inspiring performing arts
- Rich cultural activities

Our Arcadia community has accomplished excellence in many of the above areas. To

make further improvements and to maintain excellence, building community is essential. ACA is very much involved in building community. It emphasizes volunteering and establishing excellent relationships in the community. ACA also aims at bridging cultures and bringing benefits to everyone in the community. The recognition given to ACA by the Arcadia community results from the dedicated effort of many volunteers including Francine Chiu, David Lee, Joanna Liang, Sherry Liang, Aaron Rose, Sho Tay and Alice Wang. When I attend concerts at the Arcadia Performance Arts Center, I note that Jamie Lee represents ACA on the Board of Directors.

# 美國是世界上惟一最獨特的國家

由於美國的移民政策,使她成 為世界上惟一最獨特的國家。因此 說,只要符合她的移民資格,世界 上各族各方各國各地都可以移民來 到美國。於是幾乎所有公共場合的 地方,例如:大的購物中心、超級 市場、音樂會、體育館、運動會、 政治集會、電影院、娛樂中心、 學校、電影院、跑馬場、大旅館、 公園.......等等,你都可以看到各 種不同膚色的民族。 所以,美國 被稱為「大熔爐」,在這個國家, 讓人有一種似乎在「世界大同」裡 的感覺。我挺喜歡這個感覺的,並 且希望能融入其中,真正成為她的 一份子,更想求大家能得到平等的 待遇。在很多年前,美國是白人至 上的國家,經過這麼多年的改革, 情況變化了很多, 白人敞開心胸, 不再堅持他們是最優秀的民族, 相信行行出狀元,一山比一山高, 每個民族都有她的優點和特長。

在你所住的社區裡,你不一 定可以看到各種各類的人,原因在 於大多數的人還是傾向於和同種類 的人聚在一起。就拿我們的Arcadia市來說吧,大約五十年前,住 在這裡的百分之九十八左右都是白 人。漸漸的,白人把房子賣給從臺 灣移民過來的台灣人。然後近二十 年來,從中國大陸來的人,用投資 方式移民過來的,大都用現金買下 這裡的舊房子,把它拆掉,重新蓋 成豪宅式的二層樓。有的是建築商 利用當時的大好時機,盡量在Arcadia大力搜索舊房子,以求拆掉重 建獲得大利賺錢的良機。只要你到 Arcadia高中走一下,就可以發現 那裡的學生有百分之七十以上是老 中的孩子, 而其他的種族反而變為 少數了。

每一個從別國移民到美國來 的人,同時也帶進了他(或她)原 本的文化,大家彼此適應和欣賞。 首先就拿「節日」來說吧!我們除 了過美國的節日外,美國也容許來 這裡的人可以慶祝他們的節日。 就像今年9月30日,我們華協和植 物園合辦的中秋晚會,來參加的人 大約有三千人左右,各種各類的人 都有,他們已然在學習融入老中的 文化, 起碼知道中國人有一個中秋 節,是全家團聚、賞月、吃月餅的 日子。而我們老中在美國也慶祝我 們其他的節日,像農曆春節、端午 節、雙十國慶、情人節...等等。這 樣的自由,恐怕只有美國才有這樣 的大度量!

在語言方面,美國也容許你 在家在外都可以講你原來的語言。 如果你還不會說英語,甚至有可以 為你提供翻譯員的服務。當然了, 每一個來這裡的人,除非實在學不 來英語的,大家都有一個願望就是 儘量要把英語學好。總而言之, 這種語言上的自由,恐怕也是世 界上難以與她相比的。她不會因為 你「嘰哩嘩啦」的在講你原本的話 語,就大聲斥責不准你說。

除了以上所說的節日和語言 之外,其實文化的層面包括很廣, 舉凡音樂、舞蹈、文學、教育、 藝術、娛樂、生活習俗、甚至各種 不同的服裝和食物.....等等。或多 或少,都有可能在你所住的社區發 揮一些影響力。只要大家有心彼此 接納、學習和欣賞,就能使社區一 團和氣,共同建立良好的關係。大 家多認識,可以互相守望,防止偷 盗、搶劫、殺人及其他事故,讓社 區更趨安全。

再說,文化的融合的確是促進 社區建立良好關係的一大因素,這 也是今日美國漸進的楷模。這些年 來,中國的兩大節日——農曆春節 和中秋節,我們華協都舉辦活動, 讓其他族群來認識我們的一些文化 傳統,這一點,我們做得很好!在 老美的感恩節時,我們也以感恩和 回饋的心請消防局和警局的長官及 工作人員用午餐。每年舉行一次的 法律日,服務社區,讓人們得到幫 助。在萬聖節時,也應景地到Mall 去分派糖果給小朋友們。千惠有幸 能在華協和大家同做義工,感到萬 分的榮幸!我們的付出是有目共睹 的,老美和其他的族群都看到了, 這是一個多麼好的成果!一年一度 的年會更是辦得轟轟烈烈、有聲有 色,讓老美和其他族群對我們刮目 相看。居於禮尚往來的原則,我認 為我們有空也要多去參加其他族群 的活動,甚至如果能加入他們的社 團。

舉一個例子,在1999年時, 我開始加入「美國大學婦女會」 (American Association Univer-

sity Women) Arcadia Branch, -直到2016年,這個社團的解散結 束,非常可惜。原因在於缺乏新人 加入。老美的大學婦女們年紀漸漸 老邁,有許多人過世,有些人搬 家,人數越來越少。聽說多年前, 在極盛時期,會員曾多達四百多 人。在Arcadia,老中的婦女們, 有大學文憑的並不來參加,如果她 們願意來支持這個社團,也許今日 還有存在的可能性。

最後,要強調的一點,除了 好好經營我們的社團以外,真的, 我們實在有必要時,也多多去參加 別的族群所辦的活動,共同來營造 一個和諧的社區。

# 川普外孫女說中文

川普總統訪華,除了與習近平 主席和中方有關部門就國際及地緣 政治、雙方經貿、軍事、反恐及文 教領域的交流與合作舉行會談外, 川普還為習主席帶來了外孫女阿拉 貝拉的視頻。這個視頻片斷一經曝 光,迅速讓阿拉貝拉變成"網絡紅 人",成為中美兩國共同關注的人 物。

相信很多朋友已經從社群網 站看到了這段視頻。可愛的小姑 娘阿拉貝拉穿著中西合璧的旗袍, 旗袍上绣著花朵和飛舞的彩蝶。蝴 蝶常常出現在色彩鮮豔的中國畫 裏,屛風上,被面上,與各種盛開 的花卉在一起,代表喜慶、吉祥和 祝福。她先用流利的中文向「習爺 爺彭奶奶」問好,接著用中文唱 歌、背誦《三字經》和古詩。每個 中國人都耳熟能詳的"飛流直下三 千尺,疑是銀河落九天",緊緊地 抓住了人們的心。在小姑娘的琅琅 聲中,中國的大好河山好像在我們 的腦海中浮現。而"雨岸猿聲啼不 住,輕舟已過萬重山"也似乎預示 中美友好合作關係總會向前發展的 大趨勢。任何看到視頻的中國人, 心都會被這個美國小姑娘感動。 中國的語言和文化在美國發揚,連 美國總統的外孫女都說中文,背誦 三字經和古詩,中國人與有榮焉。 習近平夫婦表揚小姑娘的中文水平 大有進步,可以打"A+"。"阿 拉貝拉已成為中美友好的使者,希 望她也能有機會來中國"。川普也 說:"我們的孩子總能提醒我們, 我們擁有共通的人性和尊嚴"。

可以說,阿拉貝拉為她的外 祖父赢得了中國人民的好感。以 前,大部分中國人覺得川普對華充 滿敵意。中國老百姓對川普的印象 來自於其競選總統期間:蓮花指、 長領帶、政治素人、不按常理出 牌、口無遮攔、大放厥詞、瘋子等 等,幾乎沒有正面的形象。等到川 普當選,跌破了大家的眼鏡。通常 來講,中國人對美國各項事務的關 注,遠遠高於美國人對中國事務 的關注。按照中國人通常的思維方 式,總統為一國首腦,代表著一個 國家的形象。如此爛人竟然代表" 美國政府和美國人民",可見美國 這個國家也不怎麼樣。

而這次有阿拉貝拉的加持, 再加上川普和第一夫人在華期間很 不錯的的表現,應該可以扭轉很多 中國人對川普以及美國的印象。川 普講話基本符合各方預期,舉止言 談得體,禮貌客氣,對東道主的精

心安排一再表示衷心的感謝。最近 的媒體和社交平台幾乎全部關注著 這次訪問。從中國網友的反映看, 大家都在讚揚習主席和彭麗媛如何 衣著得體,牽手示愛,但實際上川 普夫婦在這些方面的表現也不差。 雖然幾乎沒有見到很多誇獎川普夫 婦的帖子,但也沒有看到對川普夫 婦的負面評價。從這一點上說, 川普訪華,使很多中國人改變了對 川普的看法,進而改變了對美國的 看法。

川普的推文滿溢著對習近平 的讚美之詞,這也使很多美國人和 其他國家的人民對習近平有了新的 認識。藉著川普訪華的機會,習近 平和川普頻頻在中美兩國的媒體上 露面,使雨國人民更多、更好地了 解和認識他們,人民也更加意識到 雙方友好合作的重要性。還可以使 中國人民更多地了解和認識川普總 統和第一夫人梅拉尼婭,也可以使 美國人民更好地了解習近平主席夫 婦。大國領袖之間的密切互動以及 人民之間互有好感, 無疑會有利於 兩國的關係。希望兩國將來有更多 的阿勒貝拉們,從小就開始學習了 解對方的語言和文化,做中美友好 的使者。

## The Arcadia Historical Society Celebrates its 65th Year

Early in 1952, Dewey E. Nelson, Curator for the Los Angeles State & County Arboretum, conceived the idea of an historical society in Arcadia. He did considerable work in promoting the idea in the community; however, ill health prevented him from continuing the project. He turned it over to the Woman's Club of Arcadia and its California History and Landmark Committee. Nancy L. Hutton was the committee chair and under her leadership the project flourished.

On November 16, 1952, the Woman's Club hosted an organizational meeting at their clubhouse for the purpose of forming the Arcadia Historical Society. In the invitational letter the purposes of the organization would be to (1) provide a place for fellowship and reminiscing for pioneer families; (2) have a functioning group active in the collection of historical data and relics, in the preservation of historic sites and traditions; and (3) to participate in community observances of a civic and cultural nature that emphasize historical aspects. One hundred and one enrolled as Charter Members.

On January 25, 1953, officers were elected, the name Arcadia Historical Society became official, and the Constitution and By-Laws were adopted. Dues were set at \$1.00 per year. Nancy L. Hutton took the reins as the organization's first president and she served in that capacity until 1956. The Society was incorporated in December 1954. In that same year, "THE CAMINOS" was selected as the name of the society's publication and newsletter.

Many individuals believe that the City of Arcadia or the Los Angeles County Arboretum saved the Santa Anita Depot from destruc-




tion. But it was neither of these entities. It was the Arcadia Historical Society that accomplished this feat along with the Arcadia Chamber of Commerce

In 1962, the City of Arcadia was notified that the 210 Freeway route had been established and that the Santa Anita Depot at Old Ranch Road and Colorado Blvd. was situated on this route. The city manager at the time notified Edna Lenz, the president of the Arcadia Historical Society, and asked, "What shall we do? Can we save the historic building? Who will spearhead this monumental task?"

Without hesitation, the Arcadia Historical Society responded clearly and emphatically, "The Depot must be saved and we will endeavor to meet the challenge." Edna Lenz, Bruce Wetmore, Hugh Buck and Sid & Lornetta Platford began the long and frustrating task of saving the Depot.

It took five years to fight all the "red tape" and when the Depot was given a "Point of Historical Interest" a campaign to "Save the Depot" could be The Arcadia Chamber of Commerce joined the venture and brought the citizens of Arcadia into the fundraising campaign. The Depot was saved. It was completely dismantled and rebuilt on the Arboretum grounds, and dedicated on September 25, 1970.



## The Arcadia Vietnam War Memorial Monument

Between 1966 and 1972 fourteen brave servicemen who called Arcadia. California their home lost their lives in the war in Vietnam. For their parents, the building of the Arcadia Vietnam War Memorial comes too late. But surviving relatives of the fourteen Arcadia men on the Monument's bronze plaque are comforted in knowing that their loved ones have been memorialized on this beautiful monument. The Arcadia community, Police, Fire, local businesses and veteran service organizations have been very supportive in helping build the Arcadia





With approximately 400 people in attendance, the Arcadia veterans' monument was dedicated on May 28, 2016. Now that the Monument has been built and dedicated, Gene Glasco, the Monument's Founder, has one more mission to complete and that is the installation of six low energy LED lights that will be permanently placed into the cement base surrounding the Monument. With these new lights, the Monument and flags will be illuminated from dusk to dawn, honoring Arcadia's fallen heroes in an attractive glow. Besides the beautiful aesthetics these lights will provide, the nighttime lighting should also prove deterrence to any occasional vagrancy or crime. The six in-ground LED lights will be Bluetooth compatible and will adjust from any Bluetooth enabled device to different colors, especially in patriotic red, white and blue colors on Veterans Day, Memorial Day and other observances

To help pay for the lighting project and any unexpected maintenance contingencies, the Arcadia Vietnam Memorial Monument continues to seek



tax deductible donations from individuals, community organizations and businesses. Last November, the Arcadia Woman's Club hosted a capacity crowd with a "Shine A Light on Our Veterans" dinner raising\$3,500.00 in donations towards project materials and labor which is estimated to cost approximately \$20,000.00 to finish the job. Hopes are running high that completion will be sometime during the First Quarter of 2018. Big plans are underway for a gala reception at a nearby restaurant followed by a sundown "Community Count-

down" at the Monument located near Huntington Drive in the North section of the Arcadia County Park where officials and community members will participate in a night time activation of the monument's lights for the first time.

Every generation has been asked to make their own sacrifices to protect the values that America stands for, but only the veterans of the Vietnam war was asked to do so much without the support of a grateful nation. America must never ever abandon a generation of veterans like the Vietnam Era veterans.

We can never repay the brave Arcadians who lost their lives in the Vietnam War. However, as Americans we can come together to salute an entire generation of Arcadia Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen and Coast Guardsmen who sacrificed and served their Country with honor and courage.

It is with sincere appreciation and thanks to the Arcadia Chinese Association for all their support in helping the Arcadia Vietnam War Memorial Monument create this lasting tribute to our veterans. I look enthusiastically forward to seeing you all at the Arcadia Vietnam War Monument lighting event in 2018!

## Three Trends That Are Reshaping Education

The world is changing at an ever increasing rate, and technology is making radical changes to the landscape of our educational system both inside and outside the walls of our institutions. Below you will find three trends that are currently causing students, educators, and parents to rethink the assumptions that they have about the process, and suggestions for parents and students to help navigate the changing landscape of education in our modern world, as we remember that all education starts first and foremost at home.

The internet has changed the way we receive our information about the world. With the proliferation of online learning websites that provide instant access to virtual classrooms, students can tap into a virtually unlimited supply of educational content, which they can use to further their education. The virtual landscape has also given rise to an increasing amount of social interaction via social media, gaming, and online discussion forums. According to internetlivestats.com, there are 7,486 tweets, 816 Instagram photos, 1315 Tumblr photos, 2879 Skype calls, 51,021 gigabytes of internet traffic, 63,924 Google searches, 71,750 Youtube videos, and 2,645,462 emails sent every second.

Meditation, mindfulness, and regular exercise can help students to filter out distractions, and be present in the moment. All the noise generated from social media and the constant flow of information can be overwhelming, so providing students with the ability to reshape their conscious awareness, and filter for the right information is a crucial skill for navigating the information age. So do your students a favor and find activities to help them develop a focused and quiet mind that can cut through the noise created by information overload.

The second trend is internationalization. As transportation becomes cheaper and companies continue expanding into international markets, the need to have cross-cultural awareness increases. Language skills and cultural understanding drastically increase the value that we can bring to our careers, so finding opportunities for students to live in other countries to learn the language and culture are increasingly important to their social development.

Exploring immersive experiences which allow students to live in another culture for an extended period and absorb the language and culture. While vacationing in another country for a week is a great way to dip one's toe in the water when deciding where to go for an extended time. Deep immersive experiences require one to adapt to new systems of thought, thereby offering a greater level of challenge, and yielding more tangible results that students can apply to their future interactions.

The third trend is the hyphenated career. Gone are the days when we can expect that a career

can provide us with long-term stability in the form of a steady paycheck, retirement plan and health benefits. The choice people are facing today is increasingly moving toward multiple jobs, sometimes in multiple industries. Students today need to be prepared for the reality of a rapidly changing world, and equip themselves with the skills and resilience to adapt by exploring a wide array of interests, and developing multiple skill sets so they can adapt as new industries emerge and continue to change.

Help your students d evelop resilience and situational flexibility by encouraging them to be curious and embrace failure as one of life's greatest opportunities for learning. By exposing students to challenges that stretch their abilities, and adopting a communication style that provides them a safe place to fail, they can develop the ability to adapt to the rapidly changing world.

As the great military strategist Sun Tzu said, "If you know the enemy and know yourself, you need not fear the result of a hundred battles." The same truth holds true in our modern world. By taking the time to teach our students to find their inner voice, and provide them with a broad awareness of other cultures, and by giving them the space and confidence to learn from their failures, we can teach them to turn enemies into friends, and prepare themselves to overcome any obstacle that stands in the way of their future success.

- 1. 每天進出上下班時間不要太固定,停 車的位置也不要常固定在同樣的一個 位置,不要讓他們摸到你的進出固定時 間。
- 2. 若有人跟蹤你,最好的方法是開到警察 局前面,不要馬上開回家或在附近繞來 繞去,也可開到人越多的地方,千萬不 要開到小巷或人煙稀少的地方。
- 3. 家裡的門窗,可以用一根木棍擋住,使 其不容易一下子就打開。
- 4. 出門皮包裡面不要放太多現金,也不要 提名牌皮包。那一些珠寶店的商人,很 機智的把珠寶放在麥當勞的袋子裡,或 是Carl's Junior的 袋子,或在垃圾袋 裏,這樣可以避過賊眼,在Downtown 他們這樣的做法,歹徒不注意到他有珠 寶,以遮眼法為保護安全之上策!
- 5. 房子前後旁邊的bush最好要剪短,以免 有人藏在裡面看不清楚。
- 6. 跟你的鄰居要守望相助、和彼此照顧看 守環境,使歹徒無穴可入。
- 7. 當你出外遠遊,可以在家裡用定時器使 家裡的燈在晚上會自動亮,也可以把收

音機打開,轉到 talk-show,讓他們覺 得家裡有人在、有人在講話。

- 8. 若你出外旅行較長時間,可以向警察 局報備。他們會開車在你的住處巡邏, 其他城市可以問問警察局,是否有 Vacation Check的服務。



### 旅行的季節

### 驢友的旅途、人生

旅遊導覽工作之餘, 凱瑞還撰寫一系 列暢遊北美的實用旅遊工具書,這些書 籍,除了以優美生動的文字吸引讀者外, 更提供了完整的「旅遊入門」、「旅遊指南] 等實用資訊。同時還成立了自己的網站, 給愛好旅遊的人士提供幫助與服務。

凱瑞更是一位驢友界的探索先鋒,他 自稱是「驢友先行者」。一台相機、一個 背包、一輛車、一雙腿,就開啟了一段說 走就走的旅行。每逢旅遊淡季或空閒時, 凱瑞更自己駕車,實地前往加拿大、阿拉 斯加、墨西哥等地考察探訪,近30年來, 累計已行駛里程超過20萬公里。北美導覽 員、旅遊作家、資深驢友,身兼三職的凱 瑞,多年來一直是在追逐屬於自己的遊歷 之夢。



## 茶的文化

Arnold Chien 阿諾老師

自人類有文明以來, 每個民族,部落,社群的 發展,都與茶的文化息息 相關,或怎說茶的飲用與 發展,其實正反映出那一 時代和地區特有的生活習 俗與地理資源。筆者自幼 受家父泡茶師簡德年的薰 陶,茶葉的相關知識已是 日常生活的一部分,而後



泡茶三要素:時間,溫度,置茶量。

家父常說,泡茶很簡單,小孩都會泡,把熱水沖 到茶壺不就好了嗎?重點是在泡不泡得出來好喝 的茶。家父經過多年的經驗與實證,歸納出一套 嚴謹但簡要的法則,簡稱泡茶三要素,任何人只 要遵守這泡茶三要素:時間,溫度,置茶量的原 則,必能泡出好喝的茶:

### 1. 時間:

這裡的時間指熱水沖入茶壺,到把茶倒入茶杯的 時間。茲把每一泡的基準時間,列出如下:

第一泡: 1分鐘

第二泡: 1分 + 15秒 = 1分 15秒

第三泡: 1分 15秒 + 25秒 = 1分 40秒

第四泡: 1分 40秒 + 35秒 = 2分 15秒

第五泡: 2分 15秒 + 45秒 = 3分

第五泡之後,茶質已淡,可以隨便泡。

時間是泡茶三要素中的基準點(Baseline),無論泡 哪一種茶,時間的原則不可改變。

### 2.溫度:

茶香需要溫度帶出來,除了少數的茶可用冷泡法 之外。大部分的茶都用熱水沖泡,但要多熱呢? 這就與茶的發酵程度有關(Fermentation)。

發酵程度越高的茶,可用越高温度的熱水沖泡。 如下:

不發酵茶: 70~80度C.

例如:綠茶,龍井,碧螺春。

不發酵茶: 80~90度C.



例如:烏龍茶,鐵觀音。 不發酵茶: 90~100度C. 例如:錫蘭紅茶,金駿 眉。

### 3. 置茶量:

根據人數多寡,置茶量可 做調整。一般來說,五人 以上為大桶茶的泡法(Volume)。五人以下為功夫茶

泡法,以半球捲曲烏龍茶為基準的置茶量為2茶 匙(約150克)。若茶葉比較蓬鬆像百毫烏龍則可以 多加一些,若是全球搽曲的茶葉密度較高像鐵觀 音,則可以酌減一些。

近幾年來茶葉與流行文化相結合,也與咖 啡文化相結合,發展出另外一片天地。正反映 出當代文明對復古文化的衝擊,但筆者樂觀其 成。Because this is how culture formed.

## 適合投資的美國房地產類型

如果在美國投資房產,那麼下面這些是你適 合投資的美國房地產類型,你可以考慮一下。

### 1. 獨立別墅 (Single Family House)

獨立別墅為獨立建築的住宅,與周邊房屋無共用 的牆壁,通常佔地面積較大。獨立別墅最大的優 勢是業主對房屋和土地均擁有獨立的所有權, 同時也擁有最大的私密性和處理權。無論您是來 洛杉磯投資或定居, "買賣房屋找成薇一定成!" 獨立別墅的銷售占美國非公寓住宅銷售的80%以 上。

### 2. 聯排別墅 (Townhouse)

聯排別墅的房屋和土地仍為業主獨立擁有,和獨 立別墅不同的是,聯排別墅和一家或幾家鄰居的 房屋共享公共牆壁,因此私密性和處理權都受到 一定程度的影響,最常見的聯排別墅為排屋。

### 3. 產權公寓 (Condominium)

Condominium原意為共同共有,指的是業主僅對其 公寓單元內部擁有獨立的所有權,屋頂、外牆、 公共區域及公寓房所佔土地均為所有業主所共 有。業主通常組成業主委員會,選擇專業的物業 管理公司對公共區域進行管理,費用由業主共同 承擔。除了地理位置和公寓本身的條件,業主公 約、公寓的管理情況也是投資者在選擇產權公寓 時需要考量的重要內容。

### 4. 辦公樓 (Office Building)

辦公樓在美國一般均為整棟買賣,其價值受地理 位置,所在區域的經濟景氣程度以及樓盤本身的 條件影響極大。辦公樓一般需要專業公司管理, 所以屬於積極投資,相對其他商業房地產類別, 其流動性較高。投資辦公樓的回報包括租金收入 和房產的增值,適宜高收入,並有充裕的初始資 金的投資者。由於辦公樓的賬面價值折舊和貸款 利息均可減收應稅收入,可以為投資者提供一定 的避稅條件。

### 5. 公寓樓 (Multi-family/Apartments)

公寓樓不同於產權公寓,僅用於出租,不能按單 位銷售,買賣必須整棟進行。在房地產分類上屬 於商業地產,而非住宅,貸款也以商業房地產貸 款操作。無論您是來洛杉磯投資或定居,公寓樓 要求日常出租管理,大型的公寓群一般須聘用專 業物業管理公司進行管理,因此屬於積極投資, 流動性相對較高。與辦公樓類似,投資公寓樓的 回報包括租金收入和房產的增值,適宜高收入, 並有充裕的初始資金的投資者,也同樣可以提供 一定的避稅條件。

### 6. 購物中心 (Shopping Center)

美國的大型購物中心 (Shopping Mall)一般由專業 財團開發管理,這裡所指的主要是中小型的社區 購物中心,可以容納幾家至十數家商戶。購物中 心的價值很大程度上取決於周邊居民的數量和收 入水平,另外位置的便捷程度和停車位的多少對 於購物中心的價值也有很大的影響,同時入駐商 戶是否符合周邊消費者的需要也是重要的考量因 素。購物中心同樣需要積極的管理和高額的初始 投資。

### 7. 工業用房/ 倉儲 (Warehouse)

倉儲房產大多位於機場/碼頭/交通樞紐附近, 或靠近主要的高速公路。其價值主要取決於地理 位置,同時經濟環境,尤其是工業的景氣程度對 倉儲用房的需求影響很大。倉儲用房通常不需要 積極的管理,適合傾向高現金流,但無意投入過 多精力打理的投資者。

### 8. 土地 (Land)

在美國大部分土地為私人擁有,可以隨意轉讓。 但不同地區、不同位置的土地價格差異極大。 土地無需費心管理,但是也不產生現金收入, 流動性相對較差,比較適合開發商或者投機者投

買房投資的注意:你買房子,是不需要向 地產經紀人付任何費用的,地產經紀人主要通過 賣房的一方拿取費用。在一個地區你只要一個地 產經紀人就夠了,請尊重你的經紀人,不要找很 多人,那樣沒有任何意義,也是一種不道德的行 為,只有在跨區的時候你可以通過不同地區的經 紀人幫你投資當地的地產。

綜合網上信息,至2017年4月25日,廣 州的非裔合法人員約占廣州外國人總人口(8.8 萬人)的17%,即14,960人。如果包含(三非) 人員,大概有二十萬左右。外國人管理工作存 在不少困難,外國人遣送回國後,一些人因為 在廣東打工收入高,很快又回流了;一些孕、 病、殘人士不具備進看守所的條件,給管理工 作带來了極大壓力;即使是不犯法,也有認為 言語上過度騷擾女性者,雖然在非洲當地是屬 於正常追求,但非洲男子將非洲情感觀念帶到 中國,這種中非之間兩性交往的文化差異,使 黑人與中國女人之間的某些互動也引起廣州一 帶民間的許多不滿。在廣州的一項匿名調查 中, 廣州市民對黑人的容忍度普遍較低, 黑人 也聲稱在許多場合受到了種族歧視。2017年, 全國政協委員潘慶林於3月3日在全國政協會議 上提交一份名為《建議國家從嚴從速全力以赴 解決廣東省非洲黑人群居的問題》的提案。

如果您是一名廣州人,您的看法是什麼 呢?如果您是洛杉磯本土出生的洋人,您又如 何看待這件事情?洛杉磯房價越來越貴,中餐 廳越來越多,亞洲超市越來越普遍,公共場合 聲音越來越大, 亞裔面孔越來越多。整條街鄰 居洋人越來越少,洋人的餐廳越來越少,超市 越來越小,洋人喜爱的地方越來越偏。我和很 多本地人聊過,他們對洛杉磯本地越來越多的 外來人口表示出擔憂。表面的客套掩飾不了心 裡的不滿和敵對。這種不滿的情緒從各種他們 掌握的渠道流淌出來,像一把刀傷害雙方。我 非常擔憂!

美國是個大熔爐,無論誰樂意或不樂意, 她就是容納了各式各樣的民族。我們華人來到 了這個美麗的天使之城。我們是不是可以設想 一下,非洲裔對廣州人的看法和廣州人對非洲 裔在廣州的看法。我們也應該設想一下當地洋 人對我們華人的想法,設身處地了解洋人的心 情,盡量去化解他們的失落,失望,沮喪和敵 對,這是我們每一個華人的責任。讓他們了解 我們,理解我們,信任我們。和我們友好相 處,和平生活。

我想,我們可以做很多有益於其他族群了 解我們的事情。

比如說,我們多參加其他族群的活動,消 防局早餐會,一年一度的早餐會希望大家都能 参加。雖然越來越多地看到華人的面孔。華人 民選官員。華人協會。華人地產經紀。華人保 險經紀。我認為這遠遠不夠!我希望看到更多 的華人家庭來參加這個活動,了解您的消防人 員,了解防火知識,了解消防車,了解歷史。 了解您的鄰居!

我們每一個城市的商會也是一個相互了解 的好平台。雖然我們有一些華人參加,當然遠 遠不夠,很多人認為商會需要收年費,對本人 的生意與生活也沒有什麼業務幫助。其實參加 商會這個平台,容易認識很多朋友,了解人家 生意的模式,讓不同族裔了解我們華人做生意 的方法。「三人行,必有我師焉」,更主要的 是您参加了商會,您就是為不同文化的融合做 出巨大的貢獻了!

我們都知道,最近社區不太安寧,盜竊, 搶劫案經常發生。我們都知道守望相助。如果 我們經常邀請周圍的鄰居,同一條街的,同一 個社區的,經常來家裡聚餐。交流廚藝,聯絡 感情, 華洋互助, 增加社區的和諧。

## Law Day

The 19th Annual Arcadia Law Day was held at the Arcadia Public Library Auditorium, 20 West Duarte Road, from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. Saturday, April 29, 2017. It was an event jointly sponsored and collaborated by the City of Arcadia and the Arcadia Chinese Association (ACA). Former Mayor Gary Kovacic and ACA Director Dr. Edward Wong co-chaired the program. Law Day Attorney Lead Bob Garrett and City of Arcadia Executive Assistant Mary Buttice also supported



the event. There were about thirty volunteer attorneys and financial advisors and thirty ACA volunteers who participated in the activity. No appointment was required for this free service and everyone was welcome to attend. Translation service was available in Mandarin and Cantonese. Other languages were made available to the extent possible. Over 200 people attended this event, a number that has been steadily increasing over the past years.

Volunteer attorneys met with the public and provided them with a free oneon-one consultation for 20 minutes on general legal questions. Attorneys were divided into 10 specialty groups. They were Bankruptcy/Consumer Law, Business/Corp/Labor/Employment, Criminal Law, Estate Planning/Trust, Family Law, General Civil Litigation, Immigration, Landlord/Tenant, Personal Injury/ Workers compensation, and Real Estate. Volunteer financial advisors answered questions that often arise in correlation with legal issues such as in the areas of taxes, real estate, investment and financial planning. The attorneys were not allowed to solicit business or accept any cases from the people they met. Realtime adjustments were made to match up client's questions with the appropriate







attorneys, which was a particular challenge to Gary and Bob who assigned attorneys to cases.

Out of the 200 clients who attended, over half came from Arcadia. Temple City was second with 6% and Pasadena with 5%. The rest came from about 20 cities in neighborhood communities, which include as far out as Fountain Valley, Hawthorne and San Diego.

Out of the 10 legal specialties, the most popular subject of inquiry was Business/Corp/Labor/Employment, followed by Immigration. The areas that were least inquired were Bankruptcy/Consumer Law and Family Law.

ACA has been a partner with the City of Arcadia in promoting and organizing the event since a couple years after it began. The event is the most meaningful one for ACA each year and they never have trouble recruiting the many volunteers needed. There is instant gratification for volunteers to see residents in the community receive such important and helpful information.

In an effort to streamline the operation flow, ACA volunteers used "WeChat" or "text" messages to communicate between inside and outside volunteers. Openings at each attorney's table were instantly transmitted to the outside desk and the client whose question matched the attorney's expertise was called and escorted to the table promptly. This way the efficiency and traffic flow in sending clients to attorneys have improved significantly.

Our former Mayor Gary Kovacic, who is an attorney and the event's chairperson since its inception, indicated that the Law Day has provided vital legal services to the Arcadia community over the years. He was delighted to see

that the attorneys who volunteered their time. the City of Arcadia and the Arcadia Chinese Association all took great pride in being able to help our community on a one-on-one basis with their legal issues and to truly make a difference in the lives of our citizens.





